The Stanhill Take a Bow Heritage Festival, held over the weekend of September 15th – 17th at Stanhill Methodist Church, was a resounding success. The Festival, held as part of the UK Heritage Open Days festival, focussed on music, and in particular, the violin donated to the church many years ago by Leonard Briggs. The violin's condition had deteriorated over time, but with the help of a generous donation was restored to performance standard.

An exhibition at the chapel showcased the hymns of Charles Wesley and other hymn writers, past and present. There were also displays of Sunday School Anniversary photographs and hymn sheets, together with a 100-year-old printing press that was used to print the hymn sheets. Photographs were projected onto the big screen and offered the chance to reminisce about "days gone by" whilst enjoying a delicious slice of cake.

On the afternoon of the 16th, the Stories, Songs and Strings Recital took place in the chapel, with over 100 people attending, including the Mayor and Mayoress of Hyndburn, Councillor and Mrs Hurn. The minister, Rev Matt Smith welcomed everyone to the recital, and the audience heard songs from the Red Rose Singers and Richard Hooper, whilst Kate Prescott spoke of the humble beginnings of the village chapel and Charlotte Rumble explained the connection between Methodism and the Industrial Revolution.

The restored violin will be loaned out annually to a young person who wishes to embark on a career in music but lacks a suitable instrument on which to play, and the successful applicant will be chosen through a competitive process in partnership with the Lancashire Schools Music Service. The violin was then played for the first time in public by Alex Stemp, who performs regularly with leading orchestras including the Hallé. She was partnered on viola by David Aspin, a 'local lad' and Principal Viola with Orchestra of Opera North, who has performed and recorded with many of our top national orchestras. Alex and David played the Mozart Duets and were given a well-deserved standing ovation at the end of their performance.

The weekend came to a conclusion with a "Born in Song" Heritage Service on the Sunday afternoon, led by Revd. Phil Gough, Chair of the Lancashire Methodist District, and attended by around 40 people.

Local Rotary Club help out on the international stage

For the past 20 years Church and Oswaldtwistle Rotary have been very involved in humanitarian aid for under developed countries. The first project started in 2002 when the late Fred Pickering who through his daughter(who was working in Uganda) identified an area in Uganda who were sorely short of medical equipment.

At the time the old Queen's Park hospital was closing down and wanted to off load very many items ranging from beds to all sorts of medical equipment, they just wanted it shifting quickly. With around 20 volunteers from Rotary over a matter of 2 weeks 2 x 40 foot trailers were loaded up and delivered direct to Uganda.

The next project was in Nepal when President George Blenkinship became involved in a village in Nepal where drinking water had to be carried by hand from the lower reaches from the mountain area to where they were living. After getting funds from many Rotary clubs in Lancashire and Cumbria sufficient finance had been raised to install a pumping system to raise the water direct to the village. In addition a toilet block was built for the local school. The project took 3 years to complete.

The present project headed up by Rotary International Chairman Harun Miah identified an area in Bangladesh who were in a desperate need for many people to have eye treatment so they could see again and also the need for Low Cost Housing. Harun knew well the poorest area in the town of Syhlet and together with the local Rotary in the Syhlet club, plans were put in place for Church and Oswaldtwistle Rotary to organise and finance the low cost housing and provide eye camps where they could be treated by eye specialists.

Over the last 3 years over 3,000 people were treated in a total of 6 eye camps which gave people the ability to see again, and also where needed, supply them with reading glasses which Harun had arranged to be sent to Syhlet from Hyndburn.

Harun, visited Syhlet many times during the past 3 years in connection with the building of 3 low cost houses, and the eye camps which recently both were completed. Syhlet Rotary and the local media have very much highlighted the work that Harun has done and he is very much valued by the people of Syhlet.

A very impressive project, and Harun deserves the highest praise. Furthermore Harun has also arranged to send to Syhlet educational material to the local schools and has provided wheelchairs to the disabled.

The photos show the appreciation of the people of Syhlet in respect of what Harun has done for them.

When researching our family histories there are a great range of different types of records to consider. Have you thought of checking tax records? Benjamin Franklin famously did say


that in this world nothing can be said to be certain, except death and taxes. He was not thinking of family historians, but have you looked at the following tax records?

Land tax, Hearth tax, Poll tax, Window Tax

You may remember the recent Poll Tax we had to pay, but this type of taxation was not new. In 1660 a married couple had to pay 6d each and single people aged 16 and over 1/- each. Depending on your social status and the value of your estate, you may have had to pay more but there were exceptions for the very poor. A copy of the 1660 Poll Tax for this area is available to examine at the Research Centre.

The Window Tax also reminds us of the Revd Peter Walkden who, on 2nd Aug 1729 recorded in his diary, that the window assessor (who was referred to as the window peeper) was in the area and had informed him that as he had 10 windows he must brick up one of them or otherwise pay 6s per year (equivalent to £3.500). This tax was only abolished in 1851.

Enterprising Accrington

Ellison Street


When Accrington's electric tramcars were withdrawn as the system closed in stages, those not sold to other operators or dismantled by Accrington Corporation were disposed of for other uses. Put to good purpose some bodies were sold to local people, the asking price being as little as £5 each. They were utilised by their new owners in several ways, on allotments as greenhouses or henhouses, with others used by local sporting teams as temporary changing rooms. Some survived up until the outbreak of the Second World War.

During the depression of the early 1930s, Howard & Bullough whose buildings dominated the skyline of Accrington, had placed its large workforce on short-time. A couple of enterprising engineers decided to put the factory foundry to use and produced some metal setts to be laid in the manner of cobbles along the surface of a road. In October 1931 at a meeting of the General Works Committee they discussed the proposals for the reconstruction of 5 square yards of roadway on Abbey Street. This experiment would involve the laying of these cast-iron blocks onto a concrete foundation. A quotation for the manufacture and delivery from the works of H&B was considered. It was resolved the Borough Surveyor should oversee their laying at the length and width agreed for the price quoted, and that the permission of the County Council's Highways Department should be gained before this work was undertaken. Having received the go-ahead from the County's Highways Committee, a section of these blocks was laid along a central strip on Abbey Street from its junction with Plantation Street/Oak Street to beyond Black Abbey Street, as part of the replacement of the double tram track.

Unfortunately, despite having a serrated upper surface, they proved to be too slick when wet for an application of the brakes to be totally effective. How long they would have remained in use if successful cannot be established, as they were quickly lifted when the experiment proved unsuccessful. This strip was known colloquially as the 'Iron Road'.

In February 1952 the General Manager reported that two fitters working in the Transport Department, E. Pilkington and J. Hartley, had suggested modifications to the brake adjusters on the Leyland buses purchased by Accrington This he had forwarded to Leyland Motors for their approval Later he received from that Company an acknowledgement for forwarding this information, along with an expression of their sincere appreciation. It was resolved to add the Transport Committee's congratulations to these men for the initiative they had displayed in highlighting this matter.

All nine of the War-time Guy Utility buses operated by Accrington went through a programme of refurbishment during the early 1950s. Their engines were overhauled and re-fitted, whilst various other repairs were made to the bodywork with whatever else was required. The programme cost in the region of £1,500 per bus. This was all undertaken by a firm based in Blackburn, Salmesbury Engineering Ltd. The company had been involved in the construction of aircraft during the Second World War, but in peacetime adapted some spare works capacity to carry out repairs to buses, including the modifying of 'Utilities'. These included the replacement of their wooden slatted seating with leather upholstered seats. A quantity of the displaced wooden seats was purchased by Accrington Cricket Club for further use by spectators at their Thorneyholme Ground. Salmesbury Engineering (1961) Ltd closed in April 1971, and is now a site occupied by BAE Systems. (It was at the Salmesbury Factory that Donald Campbell's record-breaking Bluebird was constructed).

Life is difficult

for many at the moment but could this Fund help you?

Accrington and district Helping Hands Fund (formerly and still officially the 'Accrington Sick Poor Fund')

What is it? Just over 100 years ago, a poor very young Accrington girl called Agnes had both her hands chopped off by her drunken father, in a rage. I personally knew Agnes by visiting her at a care home on Whalley Road, when she was in her later years. She described how she staunched her seriously bleeding arm stumps by forcing them into the carpet until help arrived. This tragedy so caught the popular imagination in Accrington in 1923 that the then mayor opened a fund designed to help with medical treatment, recuperation and food for others locally who might need helping in those days well before the NHS, when any medical treatment had to be paid for. That fund still exists today and is available now for those who are in need-physically

through disability or financially. The aim is to offer a 'Helping Hand' appropriate to the need. It cannot solve all someone's problemsespecially not debts.

Who can be helped? This is a very local charity and any beneficiaries must reside within the Borough of Hyndburn. Through the years, the fund has helped towards special wheelchairs, mobility scooters, domestic appliances like fridges, washing machines, cookers, carpets, beds, cupboards, school clothing, and towards respite holidays. The trustees are flexible. Applicants must show they have a need usually for one item /activity that they would have difficulty buying outright themselves but would greatly assist them and their family. Decisions are made by the trustees who meet about every two to three months.

How to apply? Application forms are available from the Administratorthat's me- Mrs Mary-Ann Renton, by telephoning 01200 422062 or by email to maryann.renton2@btinternet.com. Sometimes, when say, a previously homeless person receives accommodation, it comes as an empty 'shell'. In such exceptional situations more than one item may be granted and quickly. Applicants also come through CAB, Homewise, Maundy Relief, Aawaz and through social workers assisting people leaving hospital.







Great Harwood District WI Meeting September 12th 2023

A talk on "Tops and Bottoms" by Karen Livesy, the Manager of Burnley Hospital's Gynaecology team, was very informative about breast and ovarian cancers.

Eight thousand cases of ovarian cancer are diagnosed annually in the U K mainly affecting those at least 55 - 60 years old. It is "A silent killer" with symptoms similar to IBS. The symptoms are, or may include, vaginal bleeding after the menopause, abdominal swelling, infections when passing urine; the bowels may be looser or constipated, feeling fuller than normal after eating, acid reflux and fluid in the tummy. The GP should be visited without delay if symptoms occur; there is no screening for this cancer but a ultra scan and the blood test CA125 that detects any cancer cells will be used. Those with a family history of cancer may get it younger and also anyone who has had breast cancer is at higher risk.

Breast Cancers can affect men as well as women particularly if there is a family history. There is a screening programme for up to the age of 70 though older people can ask their GP or ring the Breast Clinic if they want a screening.

With the help of a mannequin that had some of the characteristics of breast cancer, Karen described possible symptoms and how to find them by pressing on with the fingers to feel for lumps over the breast, neck clavicle and armpit areas monthly. Lumps may just be fibroids but other signs of possible cancer include discharge from the nipple and unusual skin appearance.







Two years ago, Bex Faragher decided to come and support Scott and Annabel in their new venture at Fairfield Boxing Club in Accrington. She just wanted to get a bit fitter and lose some weight for a healthier future with her wife, Ali. The weight has gone, but the power and drive remain and she is improving by the week, now getting ready for bout number 7. Her wife Ali, also part of the Team GB rafting team, has been there every step of the way, on her own fitness journey through SITHI and the Ladies only class, and has lost over a stone in weight herself. Both feeling at their fitness best, they competed in the European Championships in the Czech Republic in August and came away with a staggering six bronze medals and two silver medals each, as a team. Not only retaining their commitment to both sports, they insist that the reason they were able to make the podium so many times was that their raft weighed nearly 8 stone less than previous years! This is not a story about weight loss, it's a continuing source of inspiration for those people who aren't sure where to start but want to be part of a club who can encourage you to love your journey. Scott and Annabel welcome people from all backgrounds, of all ages and are committed to providing a community club that can offer something for everyone, from boxing to yoga.
