## **Gordon** Still grooming hair at 80

When Gordon Kenyon started at Crawshaws on Abbey St (now known as The Crafty Fox) at the age 0f fifteen, I wonder if he ever envisaged that he would still be cutting hair as an Octogenarian?

Well, on April 1st this year, Gordon turned 80 and that is where he still finds himself. Gordon's remarkable story saw him join the army next. At the age of 19, he married Marilyn. Together, they just celebrated their Diamond Wedding Anniversary. That, in itself, is a remarkable milestone these days, with couples tending to marry much later.

When he left the army, Gordon decided to open up his own salon on Bank Street, moving to Abbey Street. He is still in Abbey Street but moved across the road to number 33 and larger premises.

His business is called Plus 2 and now caters for male and female styling.

Gordon's first apprentice was Clive Wallwork who is featured in our picture, who then owned his own place across the road from Gordon, before retiring earlier this year.

Indeed, Gordon was responsible for training a good number of the town's current hairdressers and is still highly respected within the trade.

Gordon's talents don't end with hairdressing. He was also a member of the local band The Warriors in the 1960s, and when he left, he was replaced by Jon Anderson, who went on to global acclaim fronting the band Yes. Jon was reported as saying that he owed his career to Gordon.

Between them, Gordon and Marilyn have two children; Maxine and Philip, who is also a hairdresser.

Although Gordon is only working full time on Thursdays and Fridays now ,and halfdays Wednesdays and Saturdays, he is still in demand. Why not pop in and see what he can do for you?

## **1921** Census



The year 2025 has commenced favourably for family historians with the availability of the 1921 census on the Ancestry website. In contrast to Findmypast, where research on this census required an additional payment, it is now possible to search the 1921 census on Ancestry as part of your standard membership fee. The census is among the most valuable resources available to UK family historians, offering extensive information critical for building a comprehensive family tree.

The 1921 census provides essential details such as your ancestors' age in years and months, their address, and place of employment. For those who do not subscribe to Ancestry, free access is available at your local family history research centre located at 2 Straits, Oswaldtwistle BB5 3LU.

When the census was taken in 1921 there were nine houses at the Straits and No 2 was occupied by Thomas Freeman, aged 61, his wife, Jane (62) and their son James (30). They were corn and provision dealers. Did your ancestors made use of this business?

Over the years, our volunteers have developed several techniques to locate "missing" individuals. Therefore, if you have an elusive ancestor, consider visiting us to see if we can assist you—our services are provided free of charge. The research centre has been operating in Oswaldtwistle for over ten years, during which we have successfully helped numerous individuals start their family trees and supported others in extending their family history across several generations.



## **Keeping Your Dog Safe** in Summer

Warm weather can be lovely, but summer brings added risks for our dogs. Unlike humans, dogs don't sweat to cool down-instead, they rely on panting and a limited number of sweat glands in their paws. This makes them especially vulnerable to overheating. Here's how to help them stay safe and comfortable.

#### Walk Smart

Avoid walking your dog during the hottest part of the day, typically between 11 a.m. and 3 p.m. Instead, head out early in the morning or later in the evening when it's cooler. Always check the pavement temperature—if you can't hold the back of your hand to the ground for five seconds, it's too hot for paws.

#### Hydration and Shade Are Key

Make sure your dog always has access to fresh, cool water. Outdoors, provide plenty of shade-trees, umbrellas, or pop-up tents work well. A paddling pool or damp towel can offer extra relief, and indoors, use fans or keep curtains drawn to reduce heat.

#### **Never Leave Dogs in Cars**

Even on a mild day, the inside of a car can become dangerously hot within minutes. Leaving windows open or parking in the shade doesn't make it safe. If dogs aren't allowed where you're going, leave them at home.

#### **Cool, Calm and Enriched**

Avoid intense exercise in hot weather. Instead, focus on indoor enrichment: food puzzles, training games, scentwork, or frozen Kongs filled with dogsafe treats. Grooming also helps keep dogs cool by removing dead fur and improving airflow through the coat.

#### **Know the Signs of Heatstroke**

Heatstroke is serious and can be fatal. Look out for excessive panting, drooling, weakness, vomiting, or collapse. If you suspect heatstroke:

- Move your dog to a shaded, cool area
- Offer small amounts of water
- · Wet them with cool (not cold) water · Call your vet immediately

#### **Final Thought**

Summer should be enjoyable for everyone—including our dogs. By adjusting your routine, staying aware, and making simple changes, you can ensure your dog stays safe, cool, and happy all season long.





On September 28th 1889, a woman gave birth in a trailer car whist travelling to Clayton. In September 1891 a horse belonging to the Corporation was injured when an engine hit the driver's cart. The horse was knocked over hurting a leg preventing it from working for a week. A Committee resolved to claim the amount lost from the Tramway Company, who offered £2 compensation for the loss due to the injuries sustained by the horse, plus veterinarian's fees for ministering to the animal.

Not long after entering service in October 1907, electric car number 2 received extensive damage to its side when a horse-drawn cart backed into it on Union Road in Oswaldtwistle. It was out of service for a week. Car number 2 was unlucky, for having been damaged in the previous year it was involved in another collision this time with car number 3 on a single track section, again on Union Road, There were parts of this road where passing was impossible if another tram was occupying the single track. Both cars were damaged with the motormen sharing the responsibility due to negligence. This prompted a system of automatic signalling to be installed at those on this section.

On the night of November 11th 1911, an accident occurred on Accrington's rails involving two of Rawtenstall's cars. It would change the way trams were controlled and sound the end of the system of regenerative braking used on tramcars. The Tramways Inspector revealed a failure of the armature mechanism which had cancelled a brake application. This caused car 14 to gain speed approaching the passing loop on Manchester Road, at the junction with Harcourt Road. Reaching 25mph it derailed on the points and struck Rawtenstall car 11 standing in the loop knocking it off the rails. It was a miracle that no one was killed or seriously injured as car 14 was completely de-roofed. Fourteen passengers received injuries, the worst being those of the driver of 11. Gangs from Rawtenstall worked through the night to re-rail the two cars. The wreckage was stored at Bacup Road sheds before returning to the factory of the United Electric Car Company in Preston. Both cars were completely rebuilt with a system of magnetic braking.

The most serious accident occurred in dense fog on March 12th 1916. With visibility down to about 10 yards two cars collided head-on on the single line along Whalley Road, whilst working the Clayton service. Car number 15 was heading towards Clayton-le-Moors, whilst car number 7 was on its way back having just left the Sydney Street passing loop. The force severely damaged both leading ends, with car 7 coming off worst. Both motormen were seriously injured driver Crabtree dying some three years later having not fully recovered. The driver of car 15 William Holland, had both his legs broken, and although he recovered sufficiently did not drive again.

An incident occurred during dense fog in November 1922, when a Rawtenstall car completely missed the terminus of the Rossendale Valley services near the railway arch on Blackburn Road. The driver reached the Commercial Hotel in Church

before realising his error. He overran the crossing where trams could turn, so had no alternative but to proceed over Blackburn's tracks before he could reverse. Fortunately the next crossing point was before the lines went under the low railway bridge at Blythe's, otherwise the top deck of his car would have been lost.

A serious accident occurred on Whalley Road in December 1929. On the morning of the 17th, the rails had become iced-up on the steepest section. Approaching the bridge, the tram driver John Entwistle applied the brakes, but at the end of Owen Street the wheels locked and the car began to slide. The roadway levels off beyond the Castle Public House and he hoped that he would be able to regain control at this point. Unfortunately a heavy lorry was in the way. Its driver attempted to accelerate but could not do so sufficiently to avoid an impact. The car hit the rear of the lorry shattering the front of the tram and seriously injuring Entwistle and four passengers, all of whom suffered cuts and bruising. The lorry driver Thomas Castle from Clayton-le-Moors who was commended for his actions, eventually brought the runaway to a stand. Entwistle returned to work, following hospitalisation.

I recall a story told to me by my colleague the late Jack Wallwork. He was an apprentice compositor with Broadley in Clayton-le-Moors. Broadleys had a shop/ office on Blackburn Road between School Street and the Railway Hotel, and Jack was given the task on his way home on his six working days, to deliver printed matter there from the factory. For this he was paid an additional six pence (6d) per week. The problem was, that travel beyond the Market Place to the terminus at the foot of Eagle Street cost an extra penny (1d) in fares. So Jack was carrying out this task "for now't"!





# Town Square Site Update

Recent works on the Accrington Town Square site include significant progress at both the Market Hall and Burton Chambers. At the Market Hall, teams are actively replacing the celestial roof glazing panels, rainwater gutter, repairing the stonework which supports the bell and repairs to the chimneys, with final facade repairs being completed, checked and signed off as the scaffold is taken down. The large green doors are nearing refurbishment, with final decoration and adjustments underway.

Meanwhile, at Burton Chambers, new windows have been installed on the upper floors, which have recently been inspected by building control to confirm they meet the required standards and decoration to key external architectural features is nearly complete. Replacement external steel doors are due to be installed shortly and remedial works to the ground floor front wall are almost complete. This will create a strong platform allowing the new shopfront curtain walling to commence installation. Piling works for the new stairwell are complete.

Looking ahead, at the Market Hall, teams will finalise stonework repairs and other roof works as the scaffold starts to come down. At Burton Chambers, progress will continue on the stairwell foundations, which will support the next phase of the staircase work. Final preparations for the shop front installations continue as manufacturing is finished and they are delivered to site for installation.


As the scaffolding is coming down on the Market Hall and Burtons Chambers buildings, it will reveal the newly cleaned/ repaired iconic architecture as we prepare the sites for the internal fitting-out phase of the project. The current estimate for the opening of both buildings is likely to be later this year.

Once the fit-out tenders are returned in May the Council will have a fixed price and end dates for completion of the projects.

Operators have now been confirmed, with the appointment of Northern Lights Group as the new operator for the Market Hall. 2-Work were appointed as the new operator for Burtons Chambers last year.
